

Quite some time has elapsed since our last report and we would like to apologise to all of you who have logged on to this website expecting to read brand new news. Well, at last here is something in brief.

The tragic circumstances of the Tsunami brought in about £50,000.00 which we are using to build a school in Aceh. Land has been purchased (2500 square meters) and the building works have begun. Progress has been slower than expected because a minor earthquake and a localised hurricane knocked down some of the structure before any reinforcing could take place! We have had to rebuild much of what we had started. As well as that, the prices of building materials has more or less tripled during the last year, and the Government doubled fuel prices overnight. Everything is now horrendously expensive.

Tatik spent all of August in Aceh teaching both at our school and touring many centres giving Teacher Training which has become her speciality. This was a great success but of course was not a fund raising effort. She paid for this trip from her own resources and not from the Trust.

The new addition of a Primary School in West Java



The established kindergarten school in West Java now has 163 pupils, and has had another half built to incorporate a Primary School section. This significant development has had government approval which is testament to the first class management by Mr and Mrs Weni and Lilis, and excellent teaching qualities and dedication of the staff. (Unfortunately, the attendance of high ranking Government officials does not mean any extra funding!)

The large amount of money collected for the Tsunami victims has been allocated exclusively for Aceh. This was a conscious decision based on the fact that it was given so generously specifically with Aceh in mind. It will therefore not be used anywhere else.

We are now consolidating our plans so that Aceh can advance, while Serpong and the other established projects continue to progress successfully.

We obviously need to appeal to everyone for extra funds so that we can offer continuity to what we have now begun.
